### What is LocAle?



CAMRA LocAle is an initiative that promotes pubs stocking locally brewed real ale. The scheme builds on a growing consumer demand for quality local produce and an increased awareness of 'green' issues. It helps support local breweries and reduces 'beer miles' i.e. the number of miles and the corresponding fuel used before a pint arrives in your glass.

### What is Real Ale?

Real ale is a top fermented beer that, following fermentation, is put into a cask with yeast and some residual fermentable sugars from the malted barley. The beer undergoes a slow secondary fermentation in the cask to produce a gentle carbonation.

## WELCOME TO SETTLE AND GIGGLESWICK

Settle is a market town in the Yorkshire Dales, just off the A65, and Giggleswick is a picturesque adjoining village just over the River Ribble, less than a mile from Settle town centre. Market day in Settle is Tuesday. Don't drink and drive –there is a regular scenic rail service on the Leeds-Settle Carlisle line and the Leeds-Giggleswick-Lancaster-Morecambe line. Note: Giggleswick station is about 1 mile from Giggleswick and 1¼ mile from Settle Market Place. For bus service information visit: [www.dalesbus.org](http://www.dalesbus.org).






